From the Chief Executive Secretary

IRDSO is pleased to share the report of the activity and program implemented and conducted during the year in the form of Annual Report 2023-2024. I congratulate and appreciate each and every personnel of IRDSO team for the support and co-operation that we. With the support of the strong team, we could reach out to the most vulnerable and needy people and could work for empowering them.

During the year, IRDSO could work with projects supported by Bread for the World, Childline India Foundation, Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives, Center for Social Exclusion and Inclusion on different project.

Community Based Initiative for Sustainable Livelihood and Ensuring Rights & Entitlements for Excluded Community supported by Bread for the World helps the rural community to understand different programs and schemes of Government and enable the women in the community to access the schemes and program. The project was implemented for enabling the community for mobilizing resources for sustain livelihood.

The project on Community Based Monitoring for Rapid Assessment which was carried out in 20 villages in Thoubal with the objective for a rapid assessment to gather evidences at macro level (from community volunteers) and at micro level (from families) provided a quick analysis to policy makers for better implementation. The project could reach out to 4000 families with the support of 20 Social mobiliser and 20 data enumerators. The hybrid training on Social Protection Schemes for building the capacity of the community level volunteers could respond to key questions convincingly and facilitate the community members to the health services regarding access to social protection services.

The service rendered by the team of IRDSO under the banner of Childline is a matter of satisfaction. Responding to 534 numbers of case related to Child lost and found/Restoration, Medical Support, Shelter, Sexual and physical abuse, emotional abuse, abandoned children, Child Marriages or early elopement, children who are disabled and mentally challenged, children who are in conflict with law. During the pandemic of Covid 19, with the sticker, **“We are not Lockdown”**, the team continue the support in the infected and affected areas, quarantine centers and cover 360 outreach programs, reached out to 2288 children related to different child related activities and 1599 adults.

It is our immense happiness that we could work with and receive support from different stakeholders including Department of Social Welfare, Department of Handloom and Textile, Thoubal District, Department of Agriculture, Thoubal District, Department of Horticulture, Thoubal District, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Thoubal District, Police Department, National Health Mission, Thoubal.

We extend our gratitude and appreciation to the donors who continued the support in times of challenges like Covid 19 pandemic. We look forward to the continuous support and collectively work towards the vision of IRDSO.

Key Highlights

- IRDSO has been working with more than 300 women in the grassroots level to a total of 28 villages.
- IRDSO was able to extent relief to 620 displaced household staying at relief camps due to the ongoing Manipur crisis with the Humanitarian Support from Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiative, Bangalore and FST.
- IRDSO conducted 4 District Level Consultation at Thoubal and Kakching District each year to connect more with the marginalized women and women leaders promoting awareness on issues related to rights, gender and economic development.
- IRDSO has been working in hand with Police stations, DLSA and other line departments to liberalize the marginalized women from different sectors in the villages.
- Strengthening and capacitation has always been the objective of the programs conducted.
- Legal assistance and legal support to victims were provided.
- IRDSO implemented 6 months project for the protection of child Rights at 5 Relief Camp of Thoubal District.

Key Achievement

- 10 weavers received Mudra Loans.
- 12 women received weaver/yarn cards.
- Conducted 5 skill training programs (Food Processing, Organic Farming, Handloom/Handicraft).
- Farmer Surbala Moirangthem received multiple departmental benefits (sprinkler, loom, pump, etc.).
- Held Rights Awareness for 15 women at Lamding Relief Camp.

Projects and Programs

Chapter 1

Community Based Initiative for Sustainable Livelihood and Ensure Rights and Entitlements for Excluded Community.

The project works with communities belonging to Schedule Caste, Minority Pangals and Meetei community.

Project Objectives

- a) To empower community and enable them to access their rights and entitlements and mobilize resources to strengthen and sustain livelihood.
- b) To strengthen people institution and alliance building for networking and advocacy in various levels of micro, meso and macro with active participation of women for downtrodden neglected community.

During the year, IRDSO organized the following activities

- Endline household survey at 3 Project village area – Wangoo Pungjaomakhong, Umathel and Chairel
- Awareness on rights and entitlement.
- Consultation with CBOs and community leaders.
- Skill training on Food processing.
- Skill training on Organic Farming.
- Skill training on Handloom and Handicraft.
- Interface program with Horticulture Department.
- Training on Peace Building.

Advocacy, networking and alliance building through Campaign on Livelihood Rights.

One day awareness on Rights and Entitlement was conducted during the year 2023 at Lamding Relief Camp on 29/03/2023 with a total participation of 15 women. The displaced families in Lamding Relief camps are from Moreh and Churchandpur. The families were given awareness on the basic govt. schemes and benefits. Leaflets on Govt. Schemes and benefits were also distributed.

Advocacy, networking and alliance building has capacitated those women who are involve in the awareness and trainings organised by IRDSO. So far all 16 villages targeted have been sensitized on current issue, schemes and benefits. The targeted participants are aware of their rights and know rights and wrongs.

IRDSO organised numbers of interface with different line departments and as a result, 11 women from different villages have applied for Mudra Loan out of which 10 weavers have got the benefits of the Loan. 12 women applied and got their weaver card and yarn card.

Skill training on Food processing, Organic farming and Handloom & handicraft.



As a part of capacity building of various CBO's and PO's, skill development training on food processing, organic farming, handloom and handicraft are organised in association with Government line departments to access public facilities.

A total of 5 programs were conducted during April 2023 to March 2024, a one Day Training on Food Processing” facilitated by Telem Pintu Singh, Expert Master Trainer FASSAI FOSTAC, 1 number of “Three Days skill training on Organic Farming” and 3 numbers of skill training on Handloom and handicraft was conducted at different venue.

These skills training have been put into use in different villages. Some have started their own small business on Kouna, some started food processing in association with their self-help-groups. Some have expanded their farming by connecting with horticulture department.



After attending regular program activities conducted by IRDSO, a very hardworking farmer named “Surbala Moirangthem” from Tentha got benefits from different government departments such as water sprinkler, a greenhouse net and various seasonal plants from Horticulture Department, Loom from Handloom & Handicraft Department and compost bed sheet and Pump from KVK, Thoubal.

District Level Consultation and Skill Trainings to promote Livelihood

Two numbers of District level Consultation on livelihood was conducted. One was on the 12th of January, 2024 at IRDSO Complex. The program was organized to aware the community on livelihood development programs to help improve the quality of life for the



marginalised people to prevent dependency, reduce vulnerability, enhance self-reliance and can develop a set of specific skills. Women from Relief camps and from different work sectors participated the program. N. Tomba, Subject matter Specialist, KVK, Thoubal, Okram Medhapati Devi, Handloom and Textile Department and Malemnganba, Staff, Social Welfare Department were the resource persons of the one-day consultation program.

The other was at Chairrel Saban on the 29th February 2024. A total of 40 participant (7male and 33 female) attended the program.



Understanding Do No Harm Principle Tools

Understanding of the Do No Harm Principle Tools is a must in current situation of Manipur. IRDSO have been producing local leaders in the community level. Letting these women leaders follow the principle of Do No Harm in their future work is a success for IRDSO. In view of the social and political situation, incorporating the do no harm principle at all levels of strategy and implementation will enhance connectors and diminish dividers. Local women leaders have initiated implementing the Principle of Do No Harm to their work and this has brought changes to themselves as well as to their community.

A one-day training program on Understanding Do No Harm Principle Tools was organized by IRDSO at IRDSO training hall and Lourembam Bamon Mantop on 4th December, 2023 with a total participation 26 women. The main focus of the training is conflict transformation and peace work and to ensure real life application of the Do No Harm principles in our society. K. Shangnaidar Tontang, Secretary, WSDC was the trainer of the program.

Chapter 2

Childline India Foundation-Sahajeevan

Project Objective

Rebuilding Trust and Safeguarding the Best Interest of Children in Manipur

During the project period, IRDSO organized the following activities

- District Level Meeting
- Awareness on child rights and mental health at relief camps.
- Created Child Learning Centre at the relief camps.
- Distributed Rejuvenation Kits
- Distributed Hygienic kits
- Rejuvenation Events for IDPs at the relief camps.

District level Meeting with Stakeholders

In collaboration with CIF, Mumbai, IRDSO implemented Sahajeevan-Rebuilding Trust and Safeguarding the Best Interest of Children in Manipur at the relief camp of the Thoubal district Manipur for 6 months (July2023-December2023).

The project focus on IDPs children the at Thoubal District namely Rice research Centre, Khangabok, Lamding Relief Centre, Lamding, Kodompokpi Sports Complex Block-A, Kodompokpi Sports Complex Block-B, Kodompokpi Sports Complex Block-C, who are displaced due to the conflict occurred in Manipur in May 2023.

A total of two numbers of District Level Stakeholder meeting were conducted on 30-11-2023 and 02-12-2023 at the IRDSO Training hall. Counsellor, Data analyst, Social Worker, DCPO, Legal cum Probation Officer, DEO from the District Child Protection Unit and



the Members from Child Welfare Committee are participated on the meeting held on 30-11-2023, discussing on Finding the gaps for the children at the relief camp and Availability of sponsorship program/schemes. The meeting was resolved to intervene of the children at the camp with DCPU along with CWC. Also DCPU ensured that they will provide winter suits for the children of 0-13 yrs for the winter to link with schemes for semi orphan/orphan with available govt schemes.

On 02-12.2023, CWC Chairperson, CWC Members and counsellor and Social Worker from DCPU participated the Meeting discussing on CNCP children at the relief camp. The meeting was resolved to follow up the CNCP children at the camp, what are the facilities available for the CNCP at the camp and to further enquire about the present status for those children taken outside the Manipur, No. of children at the camp, outside the camp or at nearby relatives and ti find out the nos of children sponsored by private schools.

Community Engagement

During the period of 6 months IRDSO conducted 51 numbers of Awareness with community at the relief camps. The Awareness focus on Child Rights, Trafficking, early marriage and hygiene. IRDSO also organize mental awareness for the children at the relief camp who are displaced during the conflict.

Creating Child Learning Centre at the camp for the IDPs Children

IRDSO created Child learning centre at the 5 relief camps at Thoubal district. This platform provides the children at the camp a sense of participating, regain from chaos they witnessed and sense of trust. In this platform children at the relief camps are provided with a place with learning materials besides academic needs. With this they are encourage to participate in groups by conducting activity such as drawing competition, paper crafting, quiz, poem recitation, story telling and singing. These children at the five relief camp are also provided rejuvenation kits such as Football, badminton, carrom, volleyball, chess, picture charts so that they can engage in groups participation. Also adolescence girl children at five relief camps are distributed with hygienic kits.



Rejuvenation event at the camp

IRDSO organized two numbers of Rejuvenation events at Lamding relief camp on 26.12.2023 and at Kodompokpi Sport Complex on 27.12.2023 respectively. Mr. Romen, Chairperson of Child Welfare Committee Thoubal along with members presented the events. The events includes Musical Chair/ In and out, Badminton, Spoon Race, Tug of war, Badminton, 100 Mt.



Race for both boys and girls children at the camp. The events is actively participated by the children at the relief camp and also parents and guardian are actively involved in organising the events successfully. The program was concluded with the distribution of prizes such as study materials like notebook, pen, pencil. Also CWC chairperson also distribute cash to the merit children as prize as an encouragement in their activities.



Chapter 3

Combating Gender based Violence

With the support from APPI, Bangalore, the project is implemented in 12 villages in Thoubal and Kakching District.

Project Objectives:

1. Sensitization of women on gender.
2. Train selected women members to be leaders in their own community.
3. To get victims of gender based violence to speak up and seek justice.
- 4.

During the year 2023, IRDSO organized the following activities:

- Awareness on Gender
- Training on intensive Gender awareness
- Training on Leadership and Personality Development
- Training on Legal Awareness and Mechanism
- Training on Self – Care and Trauma Counseling
- Campaign on Gender Based Violence
- Observation of Women’s Day
- District Level Consultation

Awareness on Gender

During the reporting period, four numbers of awareness on gender were organised on 1st, 2nd, 3rd May 2023 and 23rd October 2023 at uchiwa nastao, heirok part 3 kaboleikai, heirok mayai leikai part 2 and chairel respectively. With a total of 102 women participation the awareness sessions were conducted by Nonibala Narengbam, Chief Functionary, IRDSO.

Awareness on Gender refers the understanding and recognition of the social, cultural and economic roles and responsibilities, expectations and the opportunities associated with being women and men. It involves understanding the differences and inequalities between women and men. By raising awareness on gender issues the project team aim women to

- Understand their role in society and their potential for change
- Recognize their rights and entitlements
- Recognize and address the forms of gender based violence

- Challenge gender stereotypes and discrimination– challenge traditional gender roles and expectations
- Prioritize their health and well-being
- Increase economic empowerment
- Access to resources and equal opportunities in all aspects
- Value education and personal growth
- Involved men and boys in creating a more equitable society.

By promoting awareness on gender issues, village women can become more confident, challenge stereotypes, promote inclusive practices and create a more equitable society for all.

Training on Intensive Gender Awareness

Four number of Intensive gender training were conducted during the reporting period.

- 25 & 26 April 2023 facilitated by Jubita Hajarimayum, Managing Trustee Gendi.
- 10 & 11th November 2023, 13th & 14th December and 21st & 22nd December 2023 respectively. The sessions were conducted collaborately by Nandini Thokchom and Nonibala Narengbam, Chief Functionary, IRDSO.

From this two days training, the participants would be able to understand the following key messages;

- Gender inequalities are learned through education at various levels including the family, school, religions, society and the wider community level.
- Gender stereotypes are harmful because they take a simple idea and try to say it works for everyone in a group. Gender stereotypes sometimes make people stop doing an activity they like and really want to do. They make it harder for people to be themselves and to like what they like. They are constructed through sayings, songs, proverbs, media, religion, culture, custom, education, drama, movies.
- Patriarchy is made up of structures or institutions that exclude women from participation in, or contact with, spaces of greatest power economically, politically, culturally and religiously. Patriarchy is unjust social system that subordinates, discriminates or is oppressive to women. We need to challenge patriarchal mindsets and ensure that both boys and girls have equal access to opportunities, decision making, and freedoms.

Training on Leadership and Personality Development

Leaderships and personality trainings are given to members of the women support groups who have received other training like awareness on gender, intensive gender awareness, etc. The leadership and personality development training are conducted to enable them to lead the group members and able to help and support the victims of gender based violence. The leadership and personality training is a capacity building activity for women leaders to become change agents.



The trainings were conducted to help the women understand that leadership and personality development is very important for a woman leader as there is a direct relationship between women's

involvement in social life and strengthening of values, attitudes and behavior that reflect free, fair and tolerant social interaction. However women's ideas are often unsaid or unheard, even when women are present during discussions and decision making, in community settings, or family encounter, women may participate but still be invisible. Women leaders need to develop leadership qualities and personality for inclusion of gender. During the training sessions the importance of 5W and 1H; **What, Why, Who/Whom, When, Where and How** in leadership skill and personality development were also taught.

Even though the literacy rate of women in Manipur is high but the number of women leaders are still very few. Women taking part in decision making has been a mission of IRDSO. Women leaders moulded by IRDSO taking part in contesting election in the Panchayat and Municipality level are a small achievement of IRDSO.

In the reporting period, three numbers of leadership and personality development training programs were conducted on 27 and 28 October 2023, 28 and 29 November 2023 and 27 and 28 February 2024 respectively. With a total of 82 women the training sessions were conducted at the training hall of IRDSO. The trainers were Tamthing Ruivanao, Director Development for Human Potential, Mantripukhri and RN. Boypu Koireng, Social Activist.

Training on Legal Awareness and Mechanism.

Two training on legal awareness and mechanism were conducted on 1st & 2nd December 2023 and 9th & 10th February 2024 with a total participation of 51 women from Khangabok, Heirok Tekcham, Langathel and Umathel . The trainers were B. Supriya Devi, Advocate & Panel lawyer, Manipur State Legal Service Authority and Th. Premlata, Advocate & Assistant Director, Human Rights Law Network. The training contents were Rights and entitlement, basic description of crimes committed to women and child such as physical assault, sexual assault, blackmailing, etc., equal rights, domestic violence, POCSO Act and criminal law. The

training also includes measure to be taken when coming across situation like physical assault or sexual assault.

An RTI was filed by Advocate Premlata in place of Langathel village for not getting the entitlement of Rice under National Food Security Act for 3-6 months.

Training on Self – Care and Trauma Counselling

IRDSO organized 4 numbers of Training on Self – Care and Trauma Counselling during the reporting period with a total participation of 100 women. The training sessions were held on 20 and 26 April 2023, 4 December 2023 and 2 March 2024 at the training hall of IRDSO. All training session of self-care and trauma counselling was conducted by Arunida Khumukcham, Program Coordinator and Mental Health Practitioner, Ya_All and Nitu Sanasam, Mental Health Practitioner, Ya_All. The training session was also extended to women in the frontline and displaced women who are living in the relief camps due to the current Manipur Crisis.



The training aimed

Understanding our Body's response to Mental Health issue.

- Identifying the signs and symptoms of Mental Health issue
- Understanding the need to open up about Mental Health issue to increase help seeking.
- Taking Care of our Mental Health and Self Care.

While global status for mental health problems is thirteen out of hundred which had shot up to five times following the Covid-19 pandemic in the state of Manipur, the on-going Manipur

violence has further worsened the scenario to one in every eight persons with mental health issue.

Many participants who attended the training on self-care and trauma counselling reported that the training had a positive impact to mental health, leading to increased awareness and improved practices. Their mental stress are relieve to some extent and they valued the practical self-care strategies provided, including stress management techniques, mindfulness exercises, and coping mechanisms.

Campaign on Gender Based Violence



IRDSO observed the 16 days activism on Violence Against Women 2023 on 23rd December 2023 at training hall of IRDSO Wangjing, Thoubal District. The observation was participated by 22 women from Heirok, Khangabok, Wangjing, Lamding, Langathel and Khongjom. Campaign on gender based violence aids in sending out the message of such issues to reach a larger audience thus creating larger awareness and gain support.

This year, the theme of the 16 Days is **“Investing to prevent violence against women and girls”**, focusing on the importance of investing in different prevention strategies to stop violence from its beginning.

IRDSO observed this day with a round table discussion with the participants.

Observation on International Women's Day

International Women's Day (IWD) is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. International women's day has been observed on 8th March each year since the early 1900. IWD is devoted to celebrating the achievement of women and seeking gender equality.



It is a day when women are recognized for their achievements without regard to divisions, whether national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic or political. IWD gives focus to issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women.

This year theme for IWD 2024 is **“Invest in Women: Accelerate Progress”**. This theme emphasises the critical role of investing in women's education, healthcare, economic empowerment and leadership development to accelerate progress towards gender equality.

IRDSO also celebrated the observation of International Women's Day on 8th March 2024 by organising a small gathering of women of Tekcham Khongnang Ani Karak and Tekcham Laibung Leikai. A team of 7 staffs of IRDSO organised a small gathering at Tekcham khongnang Ani Karak. A total of 35 participants took part in the gathering. The participants were delighted and ecstatic to be a part of IWD.

District Level Consultation with stakeholders

Each year 2 numbers of district level consultation on gender based violence is organised to widespread awareness on gender and current situation of gender based violence to a larger audience. Through the district level consultation, many women voice out their opinion. Their sense of duty, unity and confidence is woken by such consultations.

Two numbers of District Level Consultation was organized by IRDSO during the year 2023 for the project Combating Gender Based Violence. Both the consultations were organized at

Eikhoigee Pothashang, Wangjing on 12th December and 28th December of 2023. The total participation was 151 women and 25 men respectively.

The resource persons for the district level consultation held on 12th December 2023 were:



1. Reena Moirangthem, Legal cum Probation Officer, DCPU, Thoubal. She spoke on the topic **Impact of Harmful Practices of Early and Forced Marriage.**
2. N. Suraj Singh, MPS, Additional SP, Thoubal. He spoke on the topic **Roles of Police and Gender Based Violence**
3. Ksh. Alex Singh, Nodal Officer, One Stop Centre, Thoubal. He spoke on the topic **Services Provided by One Stop Centre and its Assistance.**

The resource persons for the district level consultation held on 28th December 2023 were:

1. Thokchom Premlata, Assistant Director, Human Rights Law Network, Imphal. She spoke on the topic **Domestic Violence Act 2005 and practical challenges in implementation.**
2. W. Ibocha Singh, MPS, SDPO, Thoubal PS. He spoke on the topic **Role of Police in combating Gender based Violence and practical challenges.**
3. Dr. Arambam Noni, Associate Professor, DM University, Imphal. He spoke on the topic **Women and electoral politics in combating gender based violence.**

District level consultation is a platform where women are given space to talk and express freely. Women are provided a platform where their opinions are taken into consideration. Their voices being heard and being part of such consultation boost their confidence.

Future Plans and Strategies

IRDSO is planning for the inclusion of Youth and adolescence in the upcoming project.

The role of youth and adolescence in leadership is increasing. Igniting the youths on leadership and women empowerment in perspective of feminism to become future leaders.

IRDSO is also planning on strengthening our website and social media platforms by creating small videos and contents to spread out voices and issues through media exposure.

Mental health is also a rising issue. Manipur is deemed to be having mental health issues due to the current turmoil. Mental health has become prime public health concern as it has huge impact on physical, social, and psychosocial health. Inclusion of more activity on mental health is a targeted goal in the coming year.
